Current students, faculty, and staff of United Seminary have full access to all the resources available on the Spencer Library web page. For basic academic search needs, choose one of the following databases from the links located at the top of our home page:

- **WorldCat.** Look for books and most types of materials — *except* journal articles, essays, and reviews — available in our library and beyond.
- **ATLA Religion Database/ATLAS** Your best source for journal articles, essays in books, or reviews in the field of religion & theology. Many are available online in full text.

Electronic Indexes

While you're on our Online and Electronic Databases page, take some time to explore the indexes available that will get you to resources in a variety of subject areas, not just religion and theology.

- **FirstSearch.** Among the indexes available here, of particular note is ECO (Electronic Collections Online). A quick browse of journal titles under Religion and Religions brings up a number of items, many of which are not in ATLA Religion Database/ATLAS.
- **CAMIO.** Contains about 95,000 works of fine and decorative art from leading museums around the world. All content is rights-cleared for educational use.
- **Academic Search Premier:** Multi-disciplinary database provides full text for more than 8,500 journals, including full text for more than 4,600 peer-reviewed titles.
- **IxTheo.** Provides reliable and comprehensive citations from journals and Festschriften in Theology and Religious Studies from the entire world, but primarily in English and European languages.

- **ProQuest Newsstand.** Full text of hundreds of newspapers around the country and the world.
- **Science Reference Center.** Comprehensive research database that provides easy access to a multitude of full text science-oriented content. This database contains full text for nearly 640 science encyclopedias, reference books, periodicals, etc.
